1 point - Stone Age homes

Read the "Skara Brae houses" section. Name the building material and two things found inside. Write three short answers.

1 point - Say hello!

Practise greeting someone, saying your name and asking how they are using the Spanish learnt in class. Write the Spanish words you used.

1 point - Make 100

Write five different pairs of multiples of 10 that total 100. Use your number bonds to 10 to help.

2 points - Put the past in order

Create a Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age timeline. Add one labelled drawing for each period.

1 point - Build a number

Choose five numbers between 10 and 100. Write each number and show its tens and ones. For example: **46: four tens and six ones**.

2 points - Through the portal

Imagine stepping through a magical doorway into a prehistoric setting. Draw it and write three sentences describing what you can see and hear.

1 point - Words that start alike

Write three pairs of words that start with the same sound to describe a prehistoric setting, such as **towering trees**. Draw your favourite pair.

2 points - Rock detectives

Look closely at three rocks. Draw them and label their colours and textures. Write one sentence explaining how you could group them.

1 point - Then and now

Draw one tool used in the Stone Age and a tool we use today for the same job. Label both and write one sentence explaining what has changed.

2 points - Make a rhythm

Create two groups of three beats using claps, taps or stamps. Practise and perform your repeating pattern to someone. Record it using six symbols.



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2 points - Complete the story

Finish this time-travel adventure in three to five sentences:

I turned the rusty key, and suddenly I was...

3 points - Fact or theory?

Read the Stonehenge article, with an adult if needed. Write two facts and one theory about its purpose. Explain how a theory differs from a fact.

3 points - Measure and compare

Estimate and measure five household objects in centimetres. Record your results in a table, order the objects by length and calculate the difference between the longest and shortest.

Try this from Week 6.

3 points - Create cave art

Practise drawing two animals using simple shapes. Choose one for a final picture using earthy colours. Write one sentence explaining your choice of colours or shapes.

3 points - Stay safe online

Write three rules for staying safe online. Create a short rhyme to help someone remember them, then teach it to someone at home.

4 points - Caring for our world

How can people with different beliefs care for our world together?

Some people follow a faith and others do not. Talk with someone at home about how everyone can help care for our world. Show **respect** by taking turns and listening. Show **cooperation** by drawing a picture together of one way everyone can help. Add one sentence explaining your idea.

5 points - Build Biscuit Henge

Make Stonehenge using biscuits and thick icing as glue. Follow the picture guide. Draw or photograph your model and write two sentences explaining what was tricky and how you kept it standing.

Ask an adult to help and check the ingredients are suitable for you. Building blocks or recycled cardboard can be used instead.
