1 POINT Spelling

3 POINT TASK Reading

When you have finished, write a book report. Include what the book was about (a summary without giving away the ending!), who you think would enjoy the book and why you would recommend it.

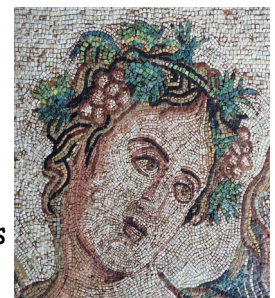


If you are unable to access your local library, write a book report on your class reading book.

2 POINT TASK Exploring Roman Art

Reflection: Look closely at the mosaic- who do you think it shows? Why would someone have wanted to make a mosaic of this person? What do you think their life was like and why? How do you think the artist felt about their subject? Why?

FOR AN EXTRA POINT: Inspiration—Now think about someone or something that inspires you. Why do they inspire you? Choose recycled materials to create your own mosaic inspired by the artwork of Ancient Rome.



2 POINT TASK PE

Find a local outdoor gym (search online). With an adult, check which equipment is suitable for children and then plan your own fitness routine. Which muscles did you use on each piece of equipment. How did you warm up and cool down? Which piece of equipment did you enjoy using the most? Write a review of your routine.

3 POINT TASK English

Write a story full of suspense. Try to use the following features which we have practised this year.

- Short sentences (I froze.)
- Fronted adverbials (of manner, time and place)
- Paragraph breaks for a change of time or place
- Dialogue (new line for a new speaker, synonyms for said and correct punctuation)



3 POINT TASK Science

Create a poster all about Sound. Using pictures, text and diagrams, answer the following questions:

- How is sound made?
- What is pitch?
- How are sounds detected?

Include some interesting facts about a topic within sound that interests you e.g.:

- How can technology help people who are hard of hearing?
- Can sounds be heard in space?

3 POINT TASK: Multiplication Game

Make a board game that helps you practise your times tables up to 12×12 . Play it with a family member or friend and ask them to write a review. Bring in your game to play with someone in your class.

5 POINT TASK Experiment/ DT

What is the best way to build a Roman trebuchet catapult?

What are the best materials to use? What is the furthest distance you can catapult one 6-block lego piece using your catapult?

Test different designs and materials to come up with your best and most effective design.



5 POINT TASK: Museum Visit

Visit a free London Museum. If you will need to eat while you are out, help make a packed lunch or snack to take with you. Help to plan your journey using a travel app such as Citymapper or TFL Journey planner and help find your way while you are out and about.

You might like to visit **The London Mithraeum**

The London Mithraeum, also known as the **Temple of Mithras**, is a Roman **Mithraeum** that was discovered in Walbrook, a street in the City of London, during a building's construction in 1954. It is an **ancient archaeological wonder** located 7 metres below street level and is **free to visit**. The temple is one of Britain's most important archaeological sites and one of only 100 Mithraic temples found throughout the ancient Roman world

Pre-booked tickets are not required but to guarantee entry, visitors are encouraged to book a free ticket in advance to ensure they are able to visit the museum at their chosen time.
