Blue & White Gingham dress in summer.



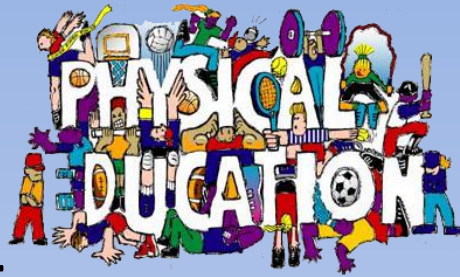

School Uniform

Please note:

- Children should only wear **stud earrings** to school.
- The Sikh kara bracelet may be worn but this must be covered with a sweatband during play time and PE. Sweatbands are available in all classrooms and to all children should they wish to wear them.
- Head coverings (hijab), hair wraps (durag) and accessories such as bands, weaves, clips, beads, bows or bobbles, for the hair, should be **plain black, blue, grey, orange or white**.
- Children **should not wear nail varnish** to school, for health and safety reasons, as the nail bed is an area first aiders may need to check if there is any injury to the head, hand or arm.



Year 3 class slots for PE

How to support your child in KS2...

Reading

- Identify a range of punctuation.
- Reading Years 3 and 4 common exception words
- Identify a range of sentence types.
- Read with greater fluency and understanding.
- Read a range of books, including non-fiction.

Writing

- Practice joining letters and developing fluency in their writing.
- Write different types of sentences and write for effect.
- Write a sentence using the correct punctuation..
- Edit and improve their own writing with greater independence.

Spellings

- Year 3 and 4 Word Lists.
- Taking part in the Spelling Bee

Handwriting

- Practise using lowercase and Upper case letters correctly.
- Practice using the cursive script with greater fluency and increase stamina for writing at length.

Mathematics

- Number recognition to 1000.
- Ordering and writing numbers to 1000
- Sorting information and answering questions on data.
- Practice their times-tables, up to 12 x 12

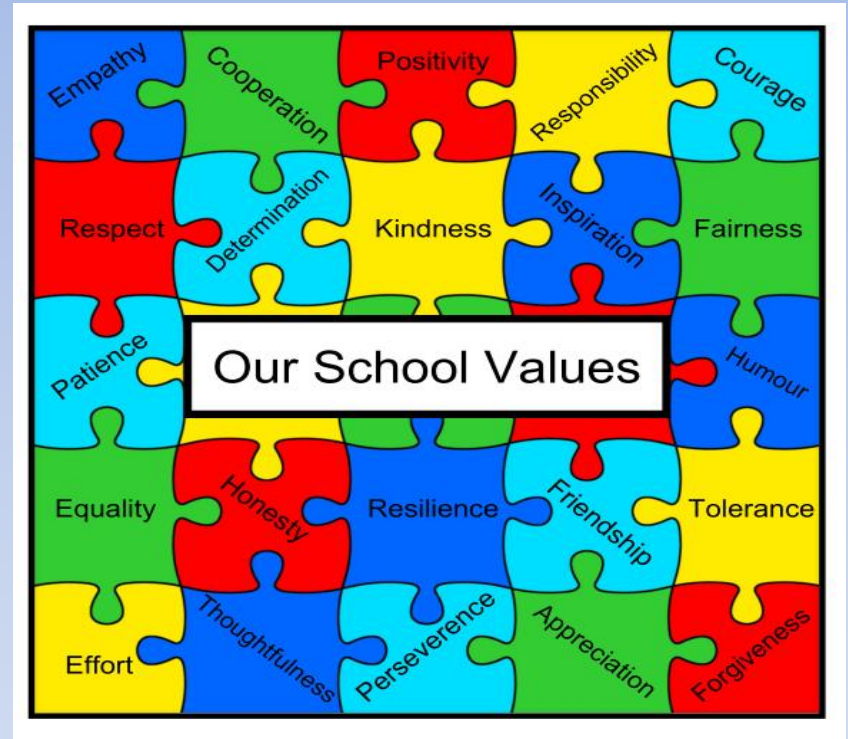
Bannockburn Bistro
