## Questions to ask your child.

What did the wolf say when he visited each of the pigs houses?

How do you think the pigs felt when they could hear the wolf outside?

What different materials would you use? Why?

The children will be able to choose from different activities with the aim of collecting up to 10 points. You and your child can choose which activities you would like to complete but remember you can only collect a maximum of 10 points but feel free to try as many activities as you like.



# One Point Activities

*Let's get fit!*

This term in PE, we will be practising different jumping skills. How many ways can you jump? Make your body big or make your body small. Can you jump forwards and backwards? Can you jump on one leg? Record how many of each jump you are able to do in one minute!



## Maps

During our Geography lessons this term we will be learning about our local area. As part of these lessons, we will be looking at maps and globes. Can you draw a map of where your house is and the street you live on?

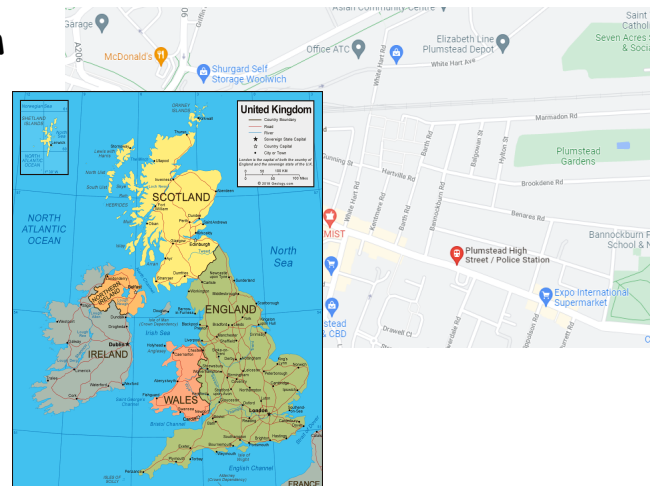
## Phonics Play

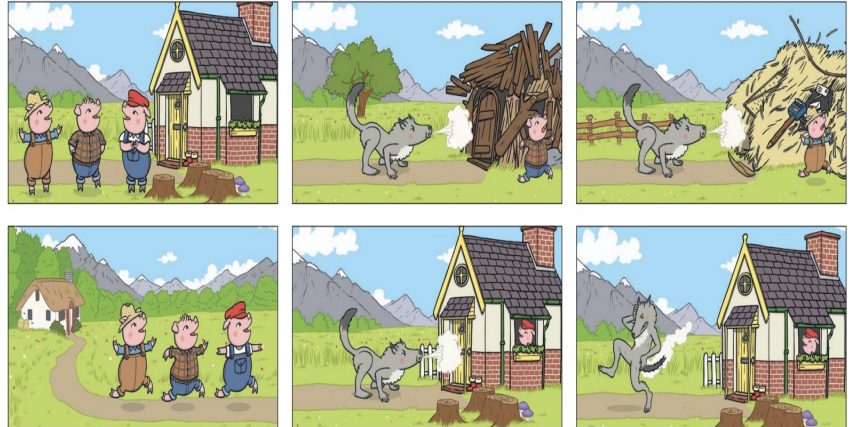

## Act it Out

## Number Challenge

We will be practising our adding and subtracting and now we have super challenge! Can you read the problems and decide what you need to do to solve it. Record your answers in a number sentence.

1. Little pig collected 10 plastic bottles from the recycling bin. 3 were too broken to use and she puts them back. How many bottles were left to use?
2. Mummy pig saw 20 boxes and 8 toilet rolls in the recycling bin. How many items did she see altogether?
3. If a brick house is 18cm tall and the little pig is 9cm tall. How much taller is the house?

# Three Point Activities

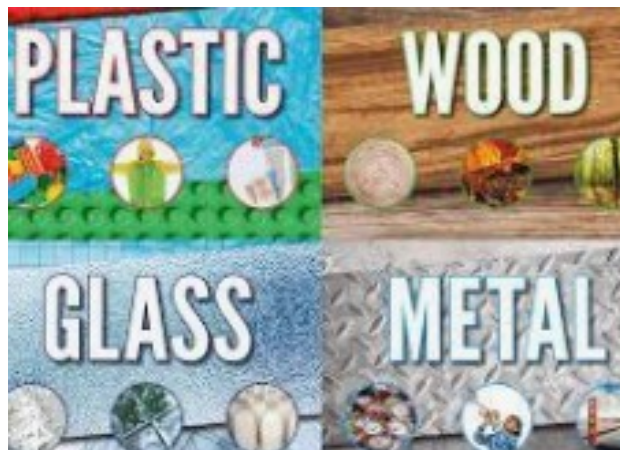
## Christianity

Can you make a mind map with all the information you know about the Christian religion? You can use pic-



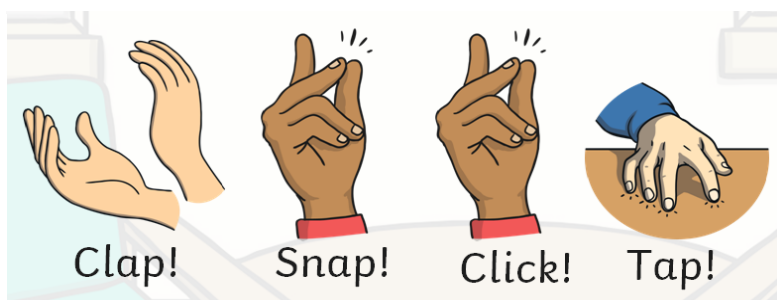
## Material hunt!

# Five Point Activities

Visit the library to find some poetry books as inspiration and see if this can inspire you. Are there any poets that you particularly enjoy reading or listening to?

## Religious Buildings



There are lots of different religious buildings in our local environment. Take a trip out to take photographs or draw different examples. Visit a local church as Christianity is our focus religion. What features can you see?

## Food Diary



Healthy eating is an important part of staying healthy. Keep a food diary for the week and match the different foods to the food wheel.
