A 'library' book – your child has chosen this
book to take home to share with you. Read it
to them/with them and talk about the story.

A reading record sheet – please log any time
that you read with your child here.

Please use the record sheet to record any
reading you have done with your child and
any comments that you would like to make.
You will also find some guidance on ways to
read with your child and questions you can
ask them whilst reading together.

Collection at Home Time

To ensure that your child is
dismissed **safely** at the end
of their session please:

- wait patiently in a line as you arrive to collect your child.
- wait for staff to call your child's name, do not call the child's name yourself.
- remind your children to wait on the carpet until staff have called their name.
- **also ensure that your contact information is up to date so that staff know who your child is permitted to leave Nursery with.**

Areas of Learning

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

What we will do: learn how to take care of ourselves. We will learn how to wash our hands thoroughly, brush our teeth well and daily habits to keep ourselves clean and healthy.

You could support by: encouraging your child to wash their hands regularly, ensuring they brush their teeth twice a day and talking about the importance of keeping clean and healthy.

Physical Development

What we will do: Play games which include moving our bodies in different way to music and then stopping when the music stops.

You could support by: Giving your child an action to follow whilst dancing to music e.g. waving, wiggling or nodding and then stopping the music for them to freeze.

Communication and Language

What we will do: learn about different animals and where they can be found. We will sort animals based on whether they live locally or far away and discuss why.

You could support by: naming animals that you see outside or taking your child to a farm to see different animals.

Maths

What we will do: begin to count to 5 using songs, rhymes and counters. Identify primary colours and experiment by mixing them together.

You could support by: Counting to 5 together, asking your child to repeat the numbers after you. Singing counting songs and nursery rhymes. Encouraging your child to count objects such as their toys.

Literacy:

What we will do: Read lots of stories together and sing a range of nursery rhymes including "Fish Alive" and "5 currant buns".

You could support by: reading stories together, looking at the illustrations and talking about the story. Singing nursery rhymes together, asking your child if they can remember the words that come next.

Creative Arts and Design

What we will do: use primary colours to create paintings and repeating patterns.

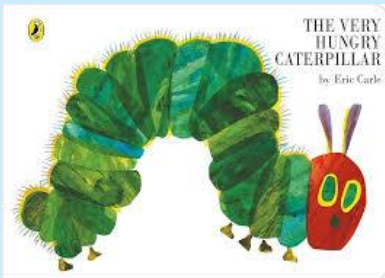
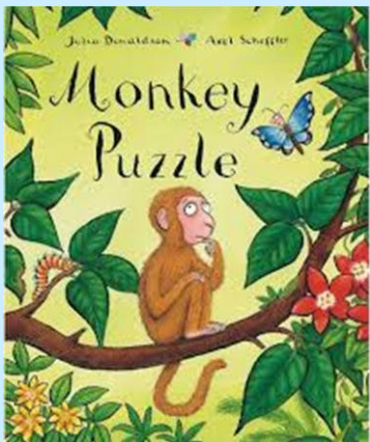
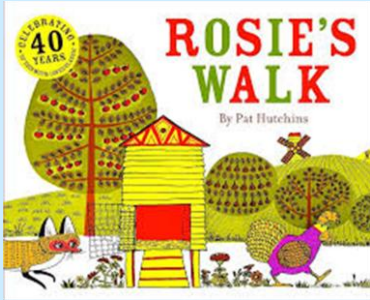
You could support by: giving your child opportunities to mark-make with a range of resources and colours.

Understanding the World

What we will do: discuss the seasonal changes happening around us.

You could support by: talking about the weather together each day and how it is the same or different to the previous day.

To further support your child's learning, you could play memory games together. This will help your child to remember and recall information. Games such as 'snap', 'I went shopping...' and 'picture bingo' are examples of memory games that you could play together.
